Dale Ford, ECIA Chief Analyst presents: The Need for an Updated Assessment of Distribution Value



Technology and the electronics industry are a powerful force driving direct and indirect markets and economies around the world.

The area of electronics components distribution presents an important area where in-depth analysis of the value created has not been studied for many

years. The value of distribution in most views is completely overlooked. This is a serious oversight given the significant value enabled by distribution services. The first phase of the January Market Trends Report provides a brief review of key aspects of the value of electronic components distribution. The opportunity to create an updated understanding of the value of the electronic component distribution/rep model is also highlighted.

ECIA has teamed up with Texas A&M University to create an update of the analysis of distribution value in a 2020 study. This updated study will deliver a valuable new dimension.
