ECIA GIPC Environmental Compliance Update

ATLANTA – The ECIA’s GIPC Environmental Compliance subgroup met recently to discuss matters that impact the electronic component industry. Environmental Compliance is one of seven areas the [GIPC tracks](#).

Specifically, the group was updated on:

- [PIP 3.0](#): Working with NAM (National Association of Manufacturers), who submitted comments to the EPA’s TSCA (Toxic Substances Control Act) on May 17th and now has until Sept to consider them.
- [SCIP](#): The EU’s order requiring the registration of products with the SCIP database is in effect. Companies are working with [Assent Compliance](#), a third party, to facilitate compliance. ECIA is currently organizing an awareness webinar with Assent. Details to be announced soon.
- [Prop 65](#): More than 80 associations have petitioned the California regulating agency to withdraw upcoming changes to labeling requirements. This issue is pending.

[Compliance and Risks](#), ECIA’s Service Partner dedicated to helping members navigate the plethora of global environmental regulations, will be hosting a webinar to update members on these critical issues.
